SESSION DETAILS

Session 1

1. Survival Guide:

Helen Tomazin, of Good Shepherd Catholic discusses how she manages her Primary School Library single handedly. From getting the best bang for your buck (aka budgeting) to creating an exciting and inviting space (aka student engagement). A mystery bag of tips and tricks. There will also be an opportunity for Q and A.

2. Running Book Fairs

Michelle Di Giacomo, of North Harrisdale Primary School will be walking and talking you through BOOK FAIRS. Michelle presents two players in this field. For those who have never organised one, this is the perfect opportunity to learn how to plan and run a Book Fair at your school. There will also be an opportunity for Q and A.

3. DOE: School library support document & guiding documents

In this session we will discuss:

- what the school library support project has achieved so far
- what is next for the school library support project
- an introduction to the library guiding documents
- ways to customise the library guiding documents
- how the library guiding documents can help to make your library stand out.

We will finish with a Q&A about the school library support project and the library guiding documents.

4. Great books and Literacy Pro for libraries

Rachel Bradley from Scholastic Australia explains why librarians are loving Literacy Pro! A valuable tool to engage those students who find reading a struggle. Rachel will also be sharing success stories from other schools explaining how staff have enhanced their libraries, from the rewards they have earned through Scholastic Book Club and Book Fairs. 1. Under the Covers @ State Library of WA: Take a glimpse between the sheets where the state collection is bedded in a tour of the State Library stacks and get the low down on the astonishing resources available to school students and educators.
